

From the Pastor

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia!

The seven Sundays in the Easter season include constant reminders of new life. Beginning with the resurrection of our Christ and continuing with appearances of this Risen Jesus, we see and hear and experience the presence of Jesus with us. We experience Jesus' presence in worship through our confession and hearing God's forgiveness, through the proclaimed Word (spoken and sung), and through the sacrament of Holy Communion. We experience Jesus' presence outside worship in the smiles and hugs of friends and neighbors, through caring neighbors in community, and through justice and peace in the world. What does your new life in Christ look like?

Easter Sunday we heard Psalm 118:24 - *This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.* This is a verse that has been central to my calling here. <u>Each day</u> we have an opportunity to experience this new life in Christ. Each new day is a gift and we choose what to do with it.

Martin Luther asks of the sacrament of Holy Baptism in his small catechism, "What then is the significance of such a baptism with water? It signifies that the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die through <u>daily</u> sorrow for sin and through repentance, and on the other hand that <u>daily</u> a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

St. Paul says in Romans 6, "We were buried with Christ through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life."

The remembrance of our baptism is a <u>daily</u> practice. When we repent, when we turn from our sinful habits and replace those practices with new habits, we live in a new way. This is what new life in Christ looks like - changed habits and behaviors in which we discover the person God created. This is the day that the Lord has made. I can choose to dwell in the struggles and sadness and chaos and criticism, or I can choose to rejoice and be thankful for the gifts I have been given. I have been given another day to breathe, to hope, and to love. I might need to splash some water on my face and make the sign of the cross on my forehead as a reminder of God's promise that I am forgiven and I am loved. Because of God's love and grace, I can rejoice. Will you join me? *This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.*
