## From the Pastor

The month of December begins with Advent's darkness and ends with Christmas' joy. One pastor wrote, "Oh, how badly our people want to skip Advent and get right to Christmas!" But Advent has its purpose. Advent is a 4 week period of preparation before Christmas. "The discipline of Advent is holding back, waiting, trusting, being patient—even being powerless. We experience our need for God to do for us what we can't do for ourselves. But it's not a desperate waiting. Hope isn't wishful thinking, it's trust in what is already present but unseen. It's a discipline of waiting in trust: surrendering, being still, listening. It's also simply naming our need, our incompleteness without God." (Pastor Steve Garnaas Holmes)

As we all know, time goes by so fast! It won't seem like long and the season of Advent will be over and Christmas will be upon us. The Savior's birth is second in importance only to his resurrection on Easter Sunday. After our 4 relatively short weeks of waiting, Christmas comes and we pull out all the stops to celebrate. Christmas tells the story of Jesus as the long-awaited King who has finally come to save us. Jesus, God's Son, the King of heaven and earth, is born in Bethlehem – the Son of God is a baby lying in a manger. God never ceases to surprise us!

So, in between the beginning of Advent and the start of Christmas there is space. This space is a gift to you for you to use as you see fit. Sometimes waiting can be active, filled with activities that help pass the time and prepare your soul to receive Jesus once again at Christmas. Sometimes waiting is passive, a time of inactivity to prepare you soul to receive Jesus once again at Christmas. Your Advent time of waiting and preparation will be unique to you. Just know that **God is with you** in what ever way you wait and prepare.

At the Church we have a few things taking place during this time between the start of Advent and the beginning of Christmas. You will see more details in this newsletter in the following pages. You are welcome and invited to be a part of these activities. On a more serious note, there will be a Longest Night Service at Peace Lutheran on December 21st. This service allows space to grieve on the darkest night of the year, even when we are surrounded by holiday "joy". The service begins at 4:00 pm. All are welcome to attend.


