FROM THE PASTOR

The weeks leading up to Christmas are a time of waiting. We have done so much waiting this year for a people who prefer instant gratification. Many have waited to get married or celebrate milestones or gather for funerals. Others have waited to enjoy the originally planned honeymoon or vacation. Some families have even waited to gather together for special occasions, in an effort to keep one another safe and healthy. Many worshipping communities in the country have not met together since March. Waiting is hard! It's certainly not fun to sit isolated...

I waited about a month longer than I might have pre-pandemic to meet the people of this parish. And, I am still waiting to be able to do some of the things in ministry that we might enjoy, like meals or fellowship time together in person. I hope that you are finding ways to create fellowship among those around you, or even family members across the country. As we wait together for this medical crisis to subside, remember that you are never alone. A promise from Paul in the letter to the Romans 8:38-39: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Romans 8:18 I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. 19 For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; 20 for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. 22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains

until now; 23 and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. 24 For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes[p] for what is seen? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Creation has been waiting for a very long time to be restored. Let us wait together with patience - not idle, but actively waiting with patience. We often use advent calendars and advent wreaths as countdown timers, building excitement with more calendar windows open, more delicious chocolate (if you have that kind), and more light with a new candle lit each week as we approach our Christmas celebrations. But they are more than countdown timers. They keep us active while we wait. The daily calendars give us something to do each day, and the advent wreaths add a bit more light to our space with each passing







A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP CRAIG SCHWEITZER

"Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing." 1 Thessalonians 5:11

This affirmation from the Apostle Paul was part of worship recently. It was something that has stuck with me in ways I did not expect. And in ways that one verse of scripture heard during a worship service rarely does. Encourage one another. Really? Build up each other. Huh? As indeed you are doing. Wait a minute Paul, seriously?? Have you seen social media lately? Have you heard the news or read a newspaper? Encourage? Build up?

I was a bit confused and more than a little challenged by Paul's affirmation. Whenever this happens, it often sends me into a time of silence. A time sitting in stillness with these sacred words. So that's what I did. And in the stillness my eyes were once again opened to the many ways and places we are indeed encouraging one another and building each other up during a year that is unlike any other in our lifetime.

Let's keep encouraging and building and praying and serving and loving because that is what God is calling us to do as followers of the risen Savior Jesus.
