Seasons of Church and Change

I wonder if we are stuck in a place where 'what we've always done' doesn't work anymore and we have a 'new' pastor and we need to identify where we are going. What has been lost that is not coming back? What is God's mission for us, and how do we connect together to accomplish it? Sometimes change requires us to leave what feels certain and enter an unknown space, a space where we can be transformed and come out the other side to be what God is calling us to be.

Each church year we look forward to a time of hope (Advent) and we experience celebration (Christmas), followed by a time where we might identify who God is and who we are as God's people (Epiphany). Then, we reflect on our current sinfulness and we are reminded of our mortality (Lent), but continue to imagine who God has called us to be. When we come out on the other side (Easter), there is new life! Next steps call us to listen to the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) and begin to live in this new way of life as Easter people.

Lent tends to be a season during the year when we focus on the need for confession and repentance, and it is important to remember that new life - resurrection is coming! Traditionally, this season has been a time of preparation to receive sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. On Wednesday evenings this year, we will worship together using an evening prayer service titled "Continuing in the Covenant of Baptism". The focus for each week is a portion of the promises made in baptism.

Sometimes we are asked to give up things that have been important to us, "the way we've always done it," in order to grow and to follow Jesus for the sake of our

neighbor. Where is our sin keeping us stuck and how might we repent/change/ be transformed in new ways of life!?

#### FALL AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

Falls are one of the leading causes of injuries in older adults and they can be significantly life-changing. How does someone know if they are risk of falling? If you experience any of the following, you may have a higher risk of falling:

- · Muscle weakness (especially in the lower body)
- · Difficulty walking
- · Vision issues
- · Balance concerns
- · Altered sensation (especially in the feet/legs)

If you feel this applies to you, talk to your doctor or a trusted healthcare professional to assess your fall risk and implement a plan to prevent falls.

While there are multiple aspects of assessing person's fall risk and fall prevention, it is beneficial to start by gaining awareness of this issue. Follow *Re-vitalize Physical Therapy* on Facebook or Instagram for more tips and information.



# BELFIELD LUTHERAN BUILD UP IFUNDRAISER \$48,003

Thank you for supporting the BLC Build Up Fund! We are excited to continue our fundraising efforts In 2022! We are a little over halfway to raising our goal of \$85,000! This year we plan to replace the flooring throughout the entire church, fix the masonry on the outside of the building, and replace the old sound system in church. We would also like to do some landscaping on the church grounds to help deter water from damaging the buildings foundation. We are also looking to improve the lighting in the Sanctuary for the Choir. We have secured estimates for the flooring and the sound system. The estimates total \$36,710.04. We hope to have these improvements completed by August 2022. 

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

This Month's Writer: Deacon Beth Anderson, Associate for Leadership & Formation Luke 13:6-9 (**NRSV**)

Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. <sup>7</sup>So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' <sup>8</sup>He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. <sup>9</sup>If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

This month we begin the season of Lent. Lent is often thought of as the 40-day journey to the cross. We embark on this journey with an eye toward the future, to the resolution of Christ's victory over death and the promise of resurrection for us all.

As Christians and as humans, we spend much of our time either looking backwards at the past or looking forward toward the future. Consider our most holy days for instance. We look back at the manger with nostalgia, often romanticizing the beauty and majesty of Jesus' birth and we and look forward to the cross & resurrection with trepidation and anticipatory hope. But in so emphasizing the bookends of Jesus' life on earth, we may forget that Jesus's ministry was not defined by these two moments alone. God's love for humanity was revealed not only in manger and tomb, but also in the millions of seconds in between. In his daily interactions, Jesus paused, took time to notice and responded to what he saw – by healing a stranger, by listening to one whom society disregarded, by calling someone to service, or by teaching a way of life that defied tradition but honored the dignity of all God's children. Through these daily interactions, Jesus' attentiveness and response reveals God's love in truly life-altering ways.

The parable at the start of this newsletter comes from our gospel reading for the 3<sup>rd</sup> week in Lent this year. I like it because it causes me to pause and wonder, "What did the gardener see in fig tree that the owner did not?" Looking to the past, the owner saw no fruit. Looking to the future, he saw only a waste of good soil. But the *gardener* noticed something else present. What evidence was emerging that caused him to intervene? This Lenten season, I invite you to take the posture of the gardener. How might you give attention to what Jesus is up to in your life and in your congregation <u>right now</u> along your journey? What signs of growth may be emerging that if examined more carefully could lead to more abundant life? What if for this season, you focused less intently on what was or what could be, and instead paused to look more closely at what God is doing right now in this in between time. What might you discover?

In the coming months, our synod is hosting several opportunities for congregations to pause and give attention to what God may be up to in our midst. We invite you to join in any of the opportunities below as you ponder: How is God inviting us to witness to Christ's love in our community right here, right now?
