# From the Pastor—Happy New Year!


Happy New Year! The new year is a time for setting new goals and celebrating the accomplishments of the last year. When called to serve this parish, I was asked to do the following:

- 1. Become acquainted with the members of Belfield, Daglum & Medora, encouraging them to become active participants in our Christian journey together.
- 2. Acknowledge, raise up, and utilize members' talents and abilities. Be a visible pastoral presence in the Belfield, Daglum & Medora communities.
- 3. Welcome members of all ages, meet with them where they are in their faith journey and guide them in their personal relationship with God, especially the youth!
- 4. Coordinate and lead the pastoral care ministries of the three congregations.
- 5. Work with members and the councils to build up attendance and to restore relationships with members.

I have also been encouraged to participate in Synod activities and Badlands Ministries Bible Camp.

Here are some of the ways I have worked toward these goals:

- 1. Weekly phone calls, visits, and written notes, connecting with members and visitors and those who are unable to attend in person. I am limited on time with the responsibilities of three congregations, but I don't want anyone to feel unacquainted. Reach out anytime you'd like to visit!
- 2. I have tried to encourage each of you with the gifts I have observed and I know that we have had more of you volunteer in worship and in our community gatherings like the pavilion suppers, the extravaganza, and the pig roast. There are many areas of our parish where your assistance is needed, so if you don't know where you can contribute, please reach out and we'll figure out where we can use your gifts.
- 3. I am excited to connect with our youngest members and I have enjoyed leading confirmation, LYO, and monthly youth gatherings. The monthly study I started two years ago has dwindled to just a few participants, so we might change things up a bit this year. (Check out an opportunity to ask faith/theological questions later in the newsletter!)
- 4. I have actively called and visited our members in nursing home facilities, as well as others who have been ill or unable to worship with us in

Let's have conversations about Bible Stories and how we experience God in our lives.


Join us in person or online for "Faith Conversations"

Santa Lucia Celebration 2023

A Celebration held at Belfield Lutheran Church on December 17th, 2023. Thank you to Bailey Ross, Ava Reddig, Camree Kling, Maci Wanner and Natalie Layton for celebrating as Saint Lucia.

Today we recognize and celebrate the life and service of St. Lucia and some o f you may wonder "Why"

Belfield Lutheran Church began as early as 1883. Rev Norby traveled about 95 miles to hold a service now and then. At the time Norby saw there weren't enough people to establish a church. He came back in 1889, when there was and did occasional services. Services were also held in Norwegian households along Norwegian Creek southeast of Belfield. At a meeting on March 4, 1907, settlers organized an official congregation which was called the Norwegian Lutheran Congregation. There were 39 charter members. The first church building was built in 1909 when the first American born Lutheran minister, the Rev. Henry Thorpe started having services in English. Morning services were done in Norwegian and afternoon services were held in English. In 1963 the current structure was built.

So now you know – we celebrate Saint Lucia here at Belfield Lutheran church in honor of our Scandinavian heritage.

Santa Lucia (Saint Lucy), whose name Lucia refers to "light", is a Catholic saint who was born in Syracuse, Sicily, in 283 AD and was martyred at the age of 20. At a time of Christian persecution, Lucia vowed at a young age to live her life in the service of Christ. According to legend, Lucia brought food and aid to Christians hiding in the Roman catacombs, wearing a candle lit wreath on her head to light her way and have her hands free to carry as much food as possible. Though she lived a considerably short life, she is still celebrated in different parts of the world almost two thousand years later, particularly in Sweden. There is speculation that stories of Lucia's brave faith were brought to Sweden by traders and even by Vikings after their journeys to Southern Europe. It is believed that Lucia and her feast day were adopted as a bearer of light at the beginning of the dark, cold Swedish winter. Her feast day, which coincided with the shortest day of the year, is widely celebrated as a festival of light. Falling within the Advent season, Saint Lucy's Day is viewed as a precursor of Christmastide, pointing to the arrival of the Light of Christ on Christmas Day.

Today's Lucia celebrations involve the oldest daughter of the family dressing in a long white robe with a red sash around her waist, along with a crown of fresh greens and lit candles worn upon her had. The young lady rises before the rest of the family and serves them traditional Lussekatter (Lucia buns), ginger cookies, and coffee. In many villages and towns across Sweden, there are Lucia processions and concerts and the celebrations signify the beginning of the Christmas season.



It has been said that we should think of St. Lucia Day as a stopping point in a busy season, a pause, a time to remind ourselves that the coming of Christmas is a celebration of the spirit. As Christians, we are called to not only walk in the light, but be the light for others. We are to be a beacon of hope and truth in a world that is dark and full of despair. When we let our light shine, we are not only Glorifying God, but also inspiring others to do the same.



## Take Your Seat at the Table

Hello BDM Parish (that's you – Belfield, Daglum, and Medora members)!

Provided are some details about how our Council functions.

Belfield council usually meets on the third Monday of every month, with online options available. Meetings typically last about 1.5hrs. Medora council meets 3-4 times/year, and Daglum meets as needed. The Parish council consists of 3 people from each congregation and they meet 4 times per year to make decisions that affect the entire parish. The majority of the meetings are:

- a) reviewing church finances
- b) discussing new business which may require Council approval and
- c) going over old business (ie. Outstanding items for review)

Finance discussions might be around new projects the church is proposing like landscaping or building upgrades. Examples of new business would include projects like a sound system or other ideas for building relationships in community.

We start with devotions and finish with prayer. We always have an enjoyable time together and recognize the importance of our role in helping congregations and the parish fulfill the mission to which God calls us.
