From the Pastor

Fall has arrived. I know this because my garden is spent, the daylight is getting shorter, the cool night air creeps in my bedroom through the open window, and the tree leaves are gathering on the ground at my back door.

To me, fall means change and I welcome it. I'm ready to retire my lawn mower for another season. I am ready to catch up on "house" work and take a break from yard work. And it is no secret, I like winter. I like the whiteness of snow, cross country skiing, and the end to flies and mosquitoes . I like the four distinct seasons in North Dakota and I embrace each one wholeheartedly.

I know last month I suggested that this time of year can be about new beginnings, but fall also seems to be a season in which we can be a little more reflective. 


