

"Mary will be happy." 'Make sure you talk to Buddy everyday and that he doesn't die alone' she said days earlier as she packed her bags to go with Don to their new life as winter hosts in Georgia.



We finished breakfast. The warm sun gave Buddy comfort as I put him carefully back in his cage before watering my planters. About 8:30 I came in to leave for Pastor's conference. Buddy had died. His earthly life ended about the same time his beloved Mary pulled out of Red Trail Campground to begin her new role in Georgia. Was that a coincidence, or a reminder that for everything there is a season? Endings and new beginnings are part of life.

I grieved the loss of of my oldest canary. Buddy hadn't sung for years. But last spring, when I brought "Elvis", my new young singer home, Buddy gave him a warm welcome like I hadn't heard for years. This summer, Buddy recovered his ability to sing thanks to personal

attention from Mary. He sang his full song just days before he died. Her kindness gave him new life!

Three people close to me dealt with deep personal challenges as the week unfolded. Two difficult situations in ministry surfaced. Friday morning, Sunday evening's abundant grace and peace seemed like a distant memory. I was reminded by the fragility of life and the reality of human vulnerability, including my own.

I remembered Pastor Joe Natwick, Associate Pastor at St. John Lutheran's wise words at text study- the week before: "The church is meant to be a place where people can be real and vulnerable; where we share our joys and our struggles and discover who we really are in community."

I knew Joe was right. I called three wise friends. They listened and cared. "My internal hard drive crashed" I shared with another face to face." "Really, they asked?" 'Yes, it did, my heart and soul had to reboot and let go of the pain, suffering, and fear that touched me this week." Maybe that's what Jesus meant when he says we are to "die to self and rise in Christ."

True friends help us let go of pain and fear and return to a life of hope based on God's unconditional grace:

"When darkness veils his lovely face, I rest on his unchain grace; In every high and stormy gale, My anchor holds within the veil. On Christ the solid rock I stand. All other ground is sinking sand."

I thank God for continually providing everything I need to live a full, abundant life at all times. I thank God that God uses ordinary vulnerable people like you and I to help others experience God's mercy, kindness grace so as to live lives of hope no matter what.

A Little Reminder...

In the long list of things you need to remember, here is another important one - make sure your congregational treasurer is paying the annual filing fee to the ND Secretary of State's Office. The corporate filing fee is important for a couple of reasons:

-It may affect whether or not your church owned property is tax exempt.

-It may affect your non-profit status and whether congregational members are legally able to deduct contributions as they file their income tax.

If the annual corporate filing fee is not paid, it can result in the state disbanding the corporation. Synod Attorney, Murray Sagsveen, recently helped one of our congregations navigate the process to reestablish their corporation. What he has learned is it is much easier to pay the annual corporate filing fee than it is to try and re-establish a corporation.

Portico...

Remember now is the time for congregations/parishes to make their coverage selections (Platinum+, Gold+, Silver+ or Bronze+) - October 5th through 30th. Employers make those selections on the Portico Employer Link website. This site has information available specifically for your congregation - including a comparison of the costs for each level of coverage.

Rostered Leaders will also make their annual selections November 2nd through the 30th. Watch your emails for reminders from Portico on these dates.


