From the Pastor

Worship

What is worship? Many of you have different experiences of worship.

- Tradition
- Being fed / spiritual renewal
- Praising God
- Praying/Plea for help
- Transformation?

For some, worship is passive - As Pastor Lisa Lewton recently blogged, "We live much of our lives as consumers. Passively, we *consume* media, products, services, and entertainment. When we passively receive something, little is expected of us. We simply receive what is offered."

In our typical Lutheran Christian worship, we include liturgy. Liturgy is the work of the people. We all work together to express our faith and grow our faith. Liturgy is not one person speaking, reading, singing, and sharing, but instead it is all of us participating together. We might sing or read responsively, engaging in "conversation" of sorts. For example, I might offer a prayer ending in "Lord, in your mercy," and the congregation will respond "hear our prayer." There is also a basic pattern for worship among Lutherans. We *gather*. We encounter God's *word*. We share a *meal* at the Lord's table. And we are *sent* into the world.


Are you a consumer or a participant? Are you gathering with others (in person or together with others online!)? When you hear God's Word, are you responding with those gathered, "Thanks be to God" (or even "really, God?")? If you are online, this might mean typing into the chat something that struck you as important or a question that it raised for you. If you are in person, this might mean continuing conversation at a fellowship time. Are you able to share in the meal of Holy Communion? How are you changed so that when you continue into the world in your everyday lives you respond to worship by loving your neighbor, serving all people, and working for justice and peace in the world?

Pastor Lisa continues, "Worship is a communal expression of our faith in Jesus Christ and our yearning for deeper faith. It is not something we rate, like an Amazon purchase, nor is worship something we complain about when it doesn't "meet our needs."

Worship is not created as an event to meet your needs. Jesus is the One who meets our needs! The Holy Spirit is active to gather us together in worship, and to enlighten us in the communal life into which we are called. Together we listen to the Holy Spirit and that requires participation. Not one of us can sit back and simply consume a single worship service.

Pastor Lisa concludes, "If you become a worship consumer, what does that mean for your neighbor who is hungry, addicted, tired, imprisoned, or depressed? Your neighbor needs the Spirit to deepen your faith as you worship in order to share the deep love of Christ with your life."



A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

Come Celebrate a Double Church Birthday!

The Evangelical Lutheran Churches in Cameroon and Central African Republic are 100 years old this year, and we are throwing a double birthday party of them. On July 7-9, 2023, Lutherans from the United States and Canada will be gathering in the Twin Cities to mark the event, and we'd like you to be there.

It was March 8, 1923, actually, when they landed in Douala, Cameroon — Norwegian-Americans with names like Adolphus Gunderson from Stoughton, Wisconsin, his bride Marie Gunderson from Bode, Iowa, and Anne Olsen and Olette Berntsen, Lutheran deaconesses from Brooklyn. Troubled by the lack of Christian witness across a wide band of African geography known as "the Sudan," they set out to share their faith with those who had not yet heard. After 26 days of walking bush trails and exploring places to begin their work, they settled down in a town called Mboula. Soon dozens, then hundreds, then thousands of African believers joined them, and our Lutheran World Federation companion churches in Cameroon and Central African Republic are the result.

And it all began 100 years this year. How often do you get to celebrate an event like that? This summer is the time.

We'll be arriving in the Twin Cities Friday, July 7th, and staying in the Hilton Garden Inn in Minneapolis, just across the street from Central Lutheran Church. Saturday morning we'll be bused to Luther Seminary for A Day of Song and Seminar. The five North American companion synods have invited Cameroonian church president Baïguele Jean, Central African church president Ngoe Joseph, and two women's leaders, Sodea Joëlle Kyria and Francine Grace Yaimann, to be present. You will hear them talk about current opportunities and challenges in their home churches. You will get to ponder how they do evangelical outreach so effectively in their context and wonder how we might do it better in ours. You will have a chance to be part of a missionary supper that evening before being bussed back to the Hilton. Sunday morning festal services at Central Lutheran will include ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton as preacher. And we will conclude our weekend over coffee and fellowship at Central before saying our farewells.

It's the event of a century. Again, we'd like you to be there. Two online registration sites are available: <u>https://sdsynod.org/sudanmissioncentennial</u> for general registration, and <u>https://sdsynod.org/glocalyouth2023</u> for a unique program for youth. Check them out. And welcome!
