From the Pastor

Happy New Year! Our church calendar begins with the season of Advent, the four weeks leading up to Christmas. It's called Advent because we are anticipating the coming of or the arrival of Christ - our Savior. Waiting is hard! I'm not sure whether it's harder to wait for something unknown, like test results that might be bad news; or if it's harder to wait for something exciting, like a new baby or a new job. Some of you might love surprises and others want to be prepared. Either way, we spend this time of Advent preparing. Many decorate trees and send cards or letters to loved ones. Some prepare to travel, others prepare to serve a family meal, and others quietly decorate in hope that indeed God comes to us, Immanuel, God with us.

In this part of the world, we wait with hibernating animals and expectations of pure-white snow covering the ground. We wait for the arrival of our Messiah who promises to bring peace on Earth. Peace be with you all as you wait and wonder and make something new!

The BLC Property Committee and the BLC Council would like to extend a huge thank you to all that have donated to our 2021 Build Up BLC Fundraiser so far! We have raised a total of \$38,682. We need an additional \$46,318 to reach our goal of \$85,000!

We have installed a new boiler, siding, windows, wall air conditioners in the kitchen, fellowship hall and Pastor's office. The entryway has been updated with new walls, paint, coat rack and lighting. The Sanctuary walls also have a new coat of paint! The new windows have new trim that has been stained as well. We still need to update the flooring throughout the entire building, fix the masonry on the outside of the building and work on the landscaping.







